Web Design and Development Project

In this project you will use everything you learn in this course to create a web site for a company or an organization of your choice, or just for one of your hobbies. You are welcome to discuss the topic you plan to choose with the instructor if you are not very sure whether it is suitable for this project.

- The project should be finished individually.
- You are expected to go through the complete design and development cycle, including the 5-step planning stage introduced in Chapter 2 of the course notes.
- The evaluation of the project will concentrate how much you use the course materials covered in this course. The marking will be based on the following factors:
 - 1. Knowledges and skills from this course used in your project (HTML, CSS, planning process, readability considerations, navigation design, proper indentations, comments, etc.).
 - 2. The amount of content presented on the website.
 - 3. Other bonus part(s).

To summarize it: the mark assigned to your project is mainly a reflection of your efforts put into developing this project that is related to the course materials.

- After finishing the website, you will need to prepare a written report about the project and all the steps that have been gone through to complete the project. More details about the report will be coming later.
- The deadline for submitting your project is 11:59pm April 10. You will need to submit every file used to build the project as well as the report. All of these files must be packed into a zip file, which should be named as <Section #><Last Name><Student #>.zip, where Section # is your class section (it should be either 001 or 002). So the name of the zip file should be like 003Deng7654321.zip. The starting page of your website must be named as index.html or home.html. The project page has been set up on Nexus. You will submit your there by 11:59pm April 10. It's under Assessments -> Assignments from the navigation menu.

• The mark for your project will be distributed as following: the report (20%), the web site (80%). If the submitted project doesn't fully meet the requirements as defined above, part of the marks will be deducted accordingly.
